It's that time of year again, when school bells welcome back students from their summer vacations and the inevitable question arises "what did you do last summer?" So, here is my version of "what I did last summer" and some other testimonies about our amazing trip July 2011 to our mission in the Dominican Republic.

Last April I was asked to assist with an upcoming youth mission trip (a combined trip with youth from MetroWest Worship Center's Activate and from LifeSong's Four 12 youth groups) that would take place in July. Well, my natural response was, "are you kidding me, me with 19 teenagers, this is a joke right"? For the record I had only one child and let's just say that my house was not the one chosen as the fun place to hang. However, after much prayer and some prodding from the Lord my spiritual response had to be yes as I felt the Lord really wanted to stretch me and I do mean stretch me! These kids just blew me away.

I have been on several trips to our mission and I felt a special blessing on this one. They did street ministry, songs and skits in the communities of Montellano, Arroyo de Leche (located in the mountains) and in the Haitian village near Montellano. As a result, many children and adults gave their hearts and confessed Jesus as their Lord and Savior. I believe through their obedience, hard work, love and dedication they changed and impacted many lives, including their own!

One special memory I have is one night we went to the rooftop of the Mission to worship and talk about the day; well let me tell you, God showed up! I was so blessed by what took place. Many opened their hearts and were transparent with one another, sharing much. There was lots of laughter and tears. They comforted and supported one another with such maturity and words of wisdom flowed out from them right down to the youngest of them all...
